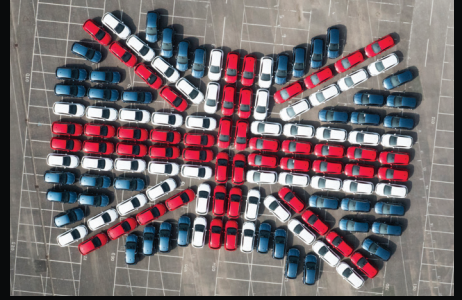

Submit your work showing Ellesmere Port is a thriving place to do business. Ellesmere Port not only has a rich industrial history, that so many local people are proud of, but is also at the heart of the economy in the North West of England, contributing to the success of the United Kingdom. As well as large, international companies that have a footprint in town, smaller and specialised businesses also do well in Ellesmere Port. The local economy is strong in manufacturing, transport, engineering, energy, research, and retail and leisure.

The organisers are hoping to get great images of businesses in Ellesmere Port that people are proud of, to celebrate the local industry. Entries could include buildings, machinery, products, transport, or skilled workers in Ellesmere Port. If you want to make a photograph of the place where you work, please ask for permission first. It could be a great way to promote the business. You are welcome to enter a photograph you have taken a long time ago. If you have not taken it yourself, a historic picture can still be entered, but cannot win a prize. Please provide the source of any historic pictures, as they may still be selected for the 2019 calendar.

**There are two categories:** one for all, and one for young people (not yet 18 years young on 10 September 2018, with a minimum of two persons participating for the prize to be awarded).

**Adrian Waine** is an award winning professional photographer from Ellesmere Port. In 2017 Adrian won the EEF Manufacturing Photography Competition in December 2017.

**Adrian said:** "I was invited to The House of Commons for the EEF awards, which in itself is a marvellous treat. Being called to the front to take the winning trophy was the real icing on the cake. Standing in front of a room full of people where everyone was clapping and wishing me well was truly a great feeling. It was also very prestigious for my client and they have done so much since with my winning photograph. Truly a triumph for British Industry and a recognition for professional photography."

The winners will be selected by a panel of judges, including the Chair of the Ellesmere Port Development Board, a member from the Ellesmere Port Photographic Society and from the Ellesmere Port Local & Family History Society, Justin Madders MP, the Mayor of Ellesmere Port, and Adrian Waine.

By entering your image, you grant to Cheshire West & Chester Council the non-exclusive right to reproduce it for any purpose at any time in any media with attribution.

All entrants under the age of sixteen must have written consent from parents or guardians to enter the competition. All submissions showing people in a recognisable way must have participant's consent and written consent from parent/guardian if under the age of sixteen.
